ANNUAL REPORT OVERVIEW

RENEWED MISSION

DALNET adopted a new mission this year renewing our commitment to be a community of libraries working together, providing access to information for research, cultural enrichment, and lifelong learning opportunities. The projects completed by the consortium this year supported our new mission and strengthened our commitment to valuing the diverse communities we serve.



ACCOMPLISHED SERVICE

DALNET worked on several major projects this year. Participating members realized the benefit of joining the state-wide union catalog and resource sharing system, MeLCat. Another highlight was a major upgrade for the DALNET shared integrated library system. Work also began for our ongoing Bibliographic and Authority File project. In addition to these services, the DALNET office assisted members with hundreds of help-desk issues. Individuals were able to keep pace with projects and activities through regular communications including the new "DALNET Details" monthly online newsletter.



CONTINUED COMMITMENTS

DALNET values proactive, creative, and affordable solutions. This year the consortium was able to offer new services while sustaining its current services and members. Even while adding new services and completing long-standing projects our operating budget realized substantial cost savings, a shared benefit of our membership.

PROJECTS



State-Wide Resource Sharing

Eleven DALNET member institutions joined the MeLCat state-wide union catalog and resource sharing system this year. The DALNET office assisted member libraries with system configurations and continues to provide daily data loads to MeLCat. Member libraries have already shared thousands of materials through the program.



Member Access to Free Online Collections

The "Distinguished American Women Collection" of full-text digital books and journals was created to celebrate Women's History Month.

The "EDUCAUSE Live!" Webinar Collection was created by DALNET practicum student Adrienne Radzvickas to provide catalog access to free online videos.



The DALNET community has established the Program Initiative Reserve as a shared resource, in support of the DALNET mission.

The DALNET Board funded several DALNET Program Initiative Reserve grants this year, including the funding of two days of RIDES delivery for each member using the service.

Additional grants awarded included:

Rochester College received an \$8,000 DALNET Grant for their "Stone-Campbell Churches of Michigan" project to digitize historical archival materials for online access.

The Henry Ford – Benson Ford Research Center received a \$19,711 DALNET Grant for their "Finding Aid Access Program" to enhance access to early Ford Motor Co. documents in their collections.

Adam Cardinal Maida Alumni Library, Detroit Medical Center, Marygrove College, and Oakland Community College received a \$44,315 DALNET Grant for creating a DALNET Digital Archive Repository.

SHARED SYSTEMS



HORIZON 7.5.1 AND HIP 3.2.1 UPGRADE

DALNET Completes Major Integrated Library System Upgrade

This year the shared integrated library system was upgraded to the most recent release of the Horizon software. The new software included several bug fixes and new enhancements. Members made several joint decisions for shared settings and have laid a foundation for future system migrations. The new Horizon Information Portal (HIP) catalog allows for members to search their own collections or to do expanded searches of specified library groups or the entire share system database.



CIRCULATION EMAIL NOTICES

New Service a Convenience for Patrons

Centralized email services were enabled for the shared integrated library system. This allowed several libraries to adopt the use of circulation email notices for the convenience of their patrons. After the Horizon upgrade several libraries also implemented a new feature to send pre-overdue email notices to remind patrons when items are almost due. Participating libraries have noted that more materials are returned in a timely manner and that email notices have saved them time and money.



SERVERS RELOCATED

DALNET Complies with New Auditor Regulations

The DALNET office worked with Wayne State University Computing & Information Technology to restructure our server configurations to be in compliance with newly adopted audit regulations. This included moving all servers to a new "hosted systems" section within the computing center. The move also allowed DALNET to decommission machines that were no longer needed and realize substantial annual cost savings on maintenance.



MARKETING & EVENTS



Staying in Touch with Our Members

The monthly online newsletter, DALNET Details, was launched in October 2010, delivering monthly communications directly to our member's inboxes.

The domain name www.dalnet.org was acquired in September 2011 for use on marketing materials and as an easy-to-remember shortcut to the DALNET Web site.



Professional development through continuing education and networking

In the fall of 2010, DALNET hosted access to a national Webinar series on Resource Description and Access (RDA) to further discussions and understanding of proposed international cataloging changes that will affect the membership.

A DALNET Educational Forum was presented in June 2011 by Barbara Heller, of the Detroit Institute of Arts, titled "Emergency Preparedness Planning."



Maximizing our Resources

A HIP catalog demonstration and training event was held in conjunction with discussions for new features and settings in the upgraded catalog. Proposed system changes were drafted by the HIP Upgrade Task Force and agreed upon by consensus of the membership.

DALNET took its new TurboMeeting online support software for a test-drive by presenting a brief Webinar for the new BookMyne mobile catalog app.


Office Manager / Systems Assistant
