Technology Competency Motions

Initial Motion

Lodged at the College Senate Meeting on Oct. 14, 2010

The Auburn Hills campus moves that the college establish a computer/technology competency requirement or assessment, apart from the Liberal Arts degree, for all students.

Revised Motion with Clarification

Lodged at the College Senate Meeting on Dec. 9, 2010

The Auburn Hills campus moves that the college establish a computer and technology literacy requirement (or assessment) for all students that obtain a degree at OCC.

Clarification: The idea of this motion is that students could benefit from having some sort of technological competency requirement in addition to the other components required by their degree programs. The Auburn Hills campus drafted a motion calling for some kind of technological or computer competency requirement for students. We left the details out because we wanted to leave the door open for further discussion. As the motion above states, establishing a technological and computer requirement might take the form of an actual class, perhaps a test, or whatever else would be appropriate for achieving the goal of technological and/or computer literacy across the disciplines.

New Motion

Lodged at the College Senate Meeting on Jan. 27, 2011

The AH campus moves to create a subcommittee that would consider a minimal computer competency that will support student success.
