

First, we have 2 full time faculty for CRJ. They are under the Social Science discipline. As for adjuncts (over 25) As for classes taught by full time, I believe they cannot exceed 5 (contract) and as for adjuncts they vary semester to semester. Because we do not offer all the crj classes all the time. We have classes at OR, and at HL and RO. Most of the classes are here at AH campus.

As for budget, well we have lab fees. We also are suppose to have a crj parapro, and that position is supposed to be split with EMS. But we have not had a crj parapro working for us. EMS has taken over the whole position, but 1/2 the budget for that has been coming out of EMS. As for other supplies, you can check with the dept. chair, Pat O'Connor and of course, the business manager at AH, Deb Swanson.
