Those arriving on the evening before High School Day shared a devotional and reception sponsored by the Student Body Association. High School Day activities then began the next morning with a special chapel program and performance by the MCC A Cappella Chorus. Following campus tours, guests returned to the chapel for a special presentation by Autumn and Brighter Days. Lunch then preceded the matinee of Celebration.

Beta Gamma and Alpha Beta social clubs captured first place honors in Celebration for their presentation, "Once Upon a Cele-

bration." The group related a visit of two prospective students with a series of humorous revisions of popular songs. The club's trophy resulted from obtaining the largest number of total points in such areas as music, costuming, club participation, originality, and entertainment value.

In addition to presentations by each of the other campus social clubs, the chorus charmed guests with "The Golden Age of Rock and Roll." Guidelines for three donor recognition programs established

Three new donor recognition programs have been announced by MCC President, Dr. Milton B. Fletcher. These clubs have been designed to say *thank you* to many of the great people who invest in the work of Michigan Christian College.

Individuals or families making contributions of \$100 up through \$999 during any calendar year will become members of the *Century Club* for that year. Annually, an *Artist of the Year* will be selected from among the alumni to paint a campus scene to be unveiled during a lectureship luncheon. The painting then will be reproduced into prints to be presented to members of the *Century Club* in appreciation for their gifts.

Individuals and families making contributions of \$1000 or more during any calendar year will become members of the *President's Circle* for that year. A suitable gift designed to say "thank you" will be presented to each member by the President and an annual *President's Circle Dinner* will be held in February.

Those individuals and families who include MCC on a non-contingent basis in their estate plans will become a part of the *Heritage Club*. This type of future gift can be accomplished through a provision in one's Last Will and Testament, through a Life Estate, through a Charitable Trust Agreement, or by making MCC the primary beneficiary or owner of a life insurance policy. Members of the *Heritage Club* will be presented with a beautiful plaque and will be invited to the annual *Heritage Club Dinner* as a guest of the President.
