Michigan Christian College — A Partnership

This Partnership was clearly illustrated last May when 820 friends contributed to our first benefit dinner. It is heartening to be sustained in God's work by faithful friends.

And it is God's work to teach the Bible to all our students . . . to encourage our young people to live right . . . to prepare future church leaders . . . to foster Christian homes . . . to train young men to preach.

We are interested in providing "the sort of education . . . the Lord approves." (Eph. 6: 4, Williams) Many parents believe that a Christian college education is a way to do it. They realize that the choice of a college is a watershed decision.

WHY YOUR CONTINUED PARTNERSHIP IS CRUCIAL . . .

Michigan Christian is our college. Your continued friendship is vital. Particularly must we have your participation in Partnership Dinner II, April 7, at Cobo Hall in Detroit.



Our Alma Gatewood Residence Hall for Women is a lovely asset. However, to meet bond commitments on this facility, we must make payments this year of \$104,439. The goal of Partnership Dinner II is to raise these dollars which simply have to be found if we are to continue serving our young people.

For the convenience of those coming from a considerable distance, the dinner will begin at 5:30 p.m. and end by about 8:30 p.m. There is no rental on Cobo Hall since we will be using the catering service which normally handles banquets there. Parking is available. Incidentally, our dinner will feature Half-Broiled Plump Chicken, done to perfection, with all the delicious trimmings.

A LOW "OUT-OF-POCKET COST" GIFT OPPORTUNITY . . .

Since your gift to Michigan Christian College via the Partnership Dinner is tax-deductible on your Federal Income Tax return (and as a tax credit for Michigan friends), the actual cost of a gift to our college is small. Surprisingly small!

Under Michigan Public Act #315, you are allowed a CREDIT against your State Income Tax equal to 50% of your gift to Michigan Christian College. The credit may not exceed 20% of your tax liability or \$100, whichever is less. FOR EXAMPLE:

If Your Michigan Income Tax Is	And Your M.C.C. Gift Is	Michigan Will Credit You	So Your Actual Cost Will Only Be
\$200	\$ 80	\$ 40	\$ 40
300	120	60	60
400	160	80	80
500	200	100	100

. . . PLUS the savings on your Federal Income Tax return!

SEIZE THESE OPPORTUNITIES . . .

1. Use your Master Charge for P. D. II tickets. (\$120 a couple or \$60 a person).
2. Make a second gift — at no cost. Sound easy? Well, it is. If you work for a company with a matching program, you can arrange to have your P. D. II contribution doubled, courtesy of your company. Over 300 companies, such as Ford, having matching programs.
3. Buy a table for 10. Bring your family. Spread joy among some of your favorite people by inviting them to be your guests. Invite a couple of high school *seniors* as a part of your "personal recruitment program."
4. Approach your employer about a couple of tickets — or a table of 10.
5. Fill a bus from your congregation.
