New Computer Scheduled for Delivery

December 13 marked the date for the new Wang VS-80 Computer System's delivery to the MCC campus.

"The Wang system will be a vast improvement. The VS-80 is as extensive and modern as anything on the market," says William Fowler, Vice President for Finance. "Not only will we be able to have more access to information, but we can have it much more quickly."

The Wang system includes the computer itself, a word processing unit, and a laser printer which will print about fifteen average size business letters per minute! It has a 256K memory with a 90 megabyte disc. "That simply means it will handle a lot of information," states Fowler.

The initial set up will equip the MCC staff with three terminals allowing several different activities to take place at the same time. With the proper hardware, the VS-80 will handle an additional 125 terminals.

According to Greg Hadfield, Data Processing Supervisor, "All of the business office records, accounts payable and receivable, and payroll, along with all of the information from the Academic Dean's office, the admissions office, as well as development office files will be stored. This new system will allow each office to operate much more efficiently."

Information is already being stored on the new computer. The entire conversion process may take several months.

Proceeds from the Associates' Fall Festival Queen's votes were dedicated to help purchase the new Wang system, and the Men's Club has adopted financial support in their budget to aid in bringing the new computer to the campus.

Garden City Church Establishes Bible Scholarship in Memory of Hobart Ashby

President Milton B. Fletcher formally announced details of the establishment of the Hobart Ashby Memorial Scholarship during Lectureship Week activi-

The scholarship agreement notes that, "Because of the love for young people and for the cause of Christian education by the Garden City church of Christ... Because of its love and respect for Hobart Ashby, former minister and elder of the Garden City church of Christ... the Garden City church of Christ does hereby convey unto Michigan Christian College... the sum of four thousand dollars for the purpose of establishing the Hobart Ashby Memorial Scholarship."

Funds will be used to award

Funds will be used to award scholarships in the Bible program at Michigan Christian College. In most cases, the scholarships will go to those who are presently preaching or who plan to preach. On occasion,

the awards will be available to elders and deacons of the churches of Christ who want to sharpen their teaching skills in the local church.

Brother Ashby died June 19, 1982 following a brief illness. In addition to his work in Garden City, he had also preached in Missouri, Mississippi, Flint, and Toledo. The governing boards of Michigan Christian College, Shults-Lewis Children's Home, and Michigan Christian Youth Camp had also benefited from Brother Ashby's service. The 1982 Michigan Missions Forum honored Brother Ashby and his wife, Mattie, for their dedication to spreading the gospel.

President Fletcher stated, "Hobart Ashby was appreciated by so many people. This is an excellent way for the Garden City congregation to continue indefinitely the work that he started. We appreciate so much their love for Christian education."

They are an unusual couple who have inspired all of us to do They are an unusual couple who have inspired all of us to do a better job with whatever we attempt. Dr. Southern taught for 34 years at Abilene Christian University in the Bible department, the last 19 of which he was the Bible department head. Mrs. Southern taught for 27 years in the public and private school systems of Texas and Kentucky. This academic year, they will have completed three years at Michigan Christian College. He has taught Bible, counseling, Greek, and other Bible related subjects. She has been teaching the developmental courses and Christian education courses. Both of them have also done extensive writing and publishing for year. them have also done extensive writing and publishing for various Christian publications. They have been outstanding examples of Christian teachers, and have exerted marvelous influence on all of us who are younger than they. He is 81 years old and she is 73, but you would never guess they were of these ages. In fact, when you start walking with them, you had better be in good physical condition!

Another aspect of their service is related to real servant-hood. They are being a tremendous financial benefit to Michigan Christian College because they are teaching without sal-ary compensation. All we do is furnish them a small apartment, transportation, and a small subsistence allowance. Both of them could demand rather sizeable salaries, but they are more interested in serving. I just trust that we are intelligent enough to properly appreciate their generosity. The likes of these people just do not appear on the scene every

Besides being of such great help to Michigan Christian College since their official retirement at Abilene in 1970, they have made a global trip encouraging missionaries around the world; five trips to Australia to teach in the Biblical studies school there; and taught at Columbia Christian College, European Christian College, and numerous camps and seminars all without salary.

We are deeply moved because of a recent action on their part. They have rewritten their Last Will and Testament and included Michigan Christian College in their estate plan. This action automatically makes them members of our new Heritage Club which honors and recognizes those individuals who remember Michigan Christian College on a non-contingent basis in their estate plan. They, along with all members of the Heritage Club, will be presented with a beautiful 9 x 12 Heritage Club plaque, and will be invited by the President to the annual Heritage Club dinner during Lectureship Week each

We say again, 'hats off" to Paul and Margaret Southern. We hope they will continue to be a part of the faculty of Michigan Christian College. We, the faculty, staff, and administra-tion, love and appreciate them, as do the students. In fact, last year, the student body dedicated the 1981-82 Totem Pole to the Southerns.

Salary Sharing Campaign Exceeds \$225,000 Goal

"We're here in the Gold Room calling about 10,000 friends of the College asking them to help the school through our Salary Sharing campaign," were often repeated words as seventy-nine callers helped raise approximately \$229,520 in pledges during this year's Salary Sharing campaign.

Fifty students and twentynine off-campus callers met during the fourteen nights of calling to ask for pledges to help make the \$225,000 goal. The majority of the 6,690 calls actually completed were to those who were not currently helping the school financially. Last year's campaign raised \$213,007.

The overall campaign consisted of three mailings to the college clientele and fourteen calling sessions running from October 25 through November 23. \$82,837 was committed by mail and \$146,683 was raised over the phone. The total pledges for this year's Salary Sharing campaign represented a 9.3 percent increase over last year's record breaking amount.

During the calling sessions, seven MCC students were credited with five or more nights in which they each raised over \$1,000. Carol Denton of Hartville, Ohio; Kim Gentry of Temperance, Michigan; Karla Lutes of Farmington Hills, Michigan; Tony Russell of Detroit, Michigan; Jeff Wafer of Detroit,

Michigan; Becky Williams of Fennville, Michigan; and Clarissa Yersick of Alpena, Michigan will each receive a dinner for two at the Renaissance Center in Detroit in appreciation for their work.

Twenty three other students also had at least one \$1,000 night during the campaign. 
President Fletcher expressed "deep appreciation for the students who participated, particularly those who helped on a consistent basis. Without their help we would not have been able to make it. Not only is this a great blessing to the school, but it helps these students get a better insight as to what it takes to balance the budget."

Jesse Clayton, Director of Development, stated how delighted he was with the overall campaign. "In this economic climate, to be able to go over our goal is absolutely thrilling. I appreciate so much all the work so many people were willing to do."

Several members of the Board of Trustees challenged the callers to raise a certain amount each evening. If that evening's goal was met, those Board members would increase their pledges to the campaign. Over \$22,000 in additional Board member contributions were added to the total as the callers met the challenges.

Many contributors work for companies that match their employees' gifts. Some \$32,000 has already come to the Salary Sharing campaign alone from matching gifts. 

Applications for financial aid for the 1983-84 academic year will be available in January, 1983. Financial aid applications will be mailed in January to every high school senior on the college mailing list.





Ricky Brown was awarded a trophy and named to the all-tournament team. The Georgia sophomore plays both center and forward for the Warriors. Last year, he received the Wes Taphin Award as an outstanding MCC basketball player.

GLBC led by eight points with just one minute left on the clock in the first half when MCC rallied. Mike Tatomir pulled down an offensive rebound and put it in to tie it up 41-41 with three seconds to go in the first half. MCC dominated the second half with good ball control and defense. The final tally gave MCC an 18 point advantage, 81-63. Ricky Brown, Noel Roberts, and Lonnie Fuller again took scoring honors.
