General Motors begins matching employee gifts

Michigan Christian College recently received its first matching gift check from the General Motors Corporation. For years, matching gift companies have provided a substantial portion of the gift income needed to balance the college's annual operating budget. General Motors is a welcome addition to the list of participating companies.

Like other matching gift companies, General Motors enables donors to make contributions to MCC and have those gifts matched by the company. General Motors now matches contributions of all full-time, active employees, whether hourly or salaried. They consider MCC as an eligible institution for matching gifts since the college now offers four-year degree programs and is accredited by the North Central Association.

Contributions of General Motors employees are matched on a dollar for dollar basis. The minimum annual contribution by an individual that may be matched by General Motors is \$100. The maximum annual contribution that may be matched is \$5,000.

To have gifts matched, General Motors employees follow the same procedure used by most matching companies. The employee obtains a matching gift form from their personnel office, completes the form, and sends it to the college. The college certifies the form and sends it on to the company.

College's hometown tops list of fastest growing communities in state

Former students of Michigan Christian College often comment on their inability to recognize the Rochester community after being away for a few years. Over the past decade, that perception has grown along with the population of Rochester Hills, which has increased 51% from 40,704 to 61,523 residents.

The numerical growth of Rochester Hills over the past ten years surpassed that of every other community in southeast Michigan, according to preliminary 1990 population figures of the U.S. Census Bureau. An official from the Michigan Department of Management and Budget could find no other community in the state that has posted a growth figure anywhere near that of Rochester Hills.

The growth of Rochester Hills has impacted the Michigan Christian College community in a substantial way. Unprecedented commercial growth has provided MCC students with limitless opportunities for part-time jobs and internships. The same unique mixture of country charm and modern development that has attracted thou-

sands to Rochester Hills has provided similar benefits to college employees and students alike.

The choice of restaurants in the Rochester community has grown from less than six during the 1960's to over sixty in 1990. Downtown Rochester has retained a vibrant business district, while three enclosed shopping malls and nine shopping centers have popped up around the city.

Twenty-three screens in three complexes now serve movie-goers in place of the old Hills Theater of downtown Rochester. The city has developed a reputation for the internationally acclaimed Meadow Brook Theatre and Music Festival and for such events as the Art 'n Apples Festival.

In an interview with the Rochester Clarion, City Community Relations Officer James Schmidt stated that "the city had anticipated a population increase but had not expected it to occur as rapidly as it did." Rochester Hills ended the decade closer to its optimal population of 75,000. Not only has it emerged as an affluent, residential community, but as an ideal college community as well.

Baker publishes book by former MCC student

Baker Book House recently released a new book, Glimpses of Grace, by Rosemary Upton, a graduate of Michigan Christian College. In her book, Rosemary relives her mother's progressive deterioration from Alzheimer's disease. She shares the emotional pressures placed upon her family and how they coped with the difficulties.

An Oakland Press review described Rosemary's book as a "compassionate look at a modern-day traumatic disease." It also stated, "Biblical quotes illustrate her Christian faith as well as her studies at Michigan Christian College.

Entering MCC at age 42, Rosemary only planned to take a few Bible courses. However, she graduated as cosalutatorian of the class of 1979. Since her studies at MCC coincided with many of the events detailed in her book, the college is often mentioned in the text.

In her book, Rosemary shared her earlier lack of interest in taking a required





Since 1980, athletic teams, the chorus, and various other student groups have traveled throughout the country in a 1963 diesel bus. Although the bus has provided dependable service for a decade, recent needs for major repairs and increased difficulty in obtaining parts made further investment in the bus impractical. After a

considerable search, the college located and purchased a newer bus, which seats forty-seven passengers. The bus arrived on time for the opening of the new academic year.

Residence halls officially opened on September 1. After three days of orientation and registration, classes began on September 5. By the close of late registration, enrollment

figures had increased slightly over the previous year by a margin of three percent.

Adding a new dimension to the student body, the college enrolled its first seniors in the Counseling major of the Bachelor of Religious Education degree. The college began offering the Counseling major last fall for those students desiring a background in personal, marriage and family, or child counseling.

States represented in the fall student body include Arizona, Arkansas, Colorado, Florida, Georgia, Illinois, Indiana, Kansas, Massachusetts, Michigan, New Hampshire, New York, Ohio, Tennessee, Texas, and Vermont. International students enrolled from Indonesia, Japan, and Zimbabwe.
