

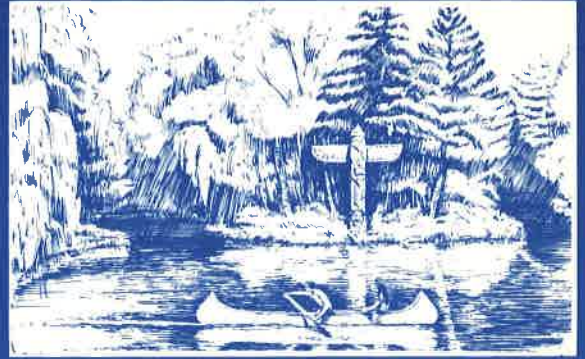

College's hometown among state's fastest growing communities

Since 1980, MCC's hometown of Rochester Hills has been the fastest growing community in southeast Michigan. In the past year, one out of every hundred homes built in the entire United States was built in Rochester Hills.

Although MCC has had a Rochester mailing address since opening in 1959, the college technically has been located in the former farming community of Avon Township. Avon Township incorporated as the City of Rochester Hills last November. The new city surrounds Rochester.

The Rochester area's unique mixture of country charm and modern development has caused its population to pass 50,000. Recently, the area has attracted major research and development firms as well as hundreds of professionals looking for a first-rate community.

Downtown Rochester offers the atmosphere of a small town, complete with a variety of small shops and a beautiful city park. Nearby cider mills that have operated for over 100 years add to the country flavor of the area. In contrast, the surrounding city of Rochester Hills features three enclosed shopping malls and six shopping centers; over forty restaurants; numerous office plazas; and hundreds of new homes, apartments, and condominiums.

Cultural events abound in the Rochester community. Meadow Brook Theatre, one of the nation's leading professional theatres, is located on the campus of Rochester's Oakland University. Hundreds visit Rochester each fall as it hosts the Art'n Apples Festival. Meadow Brook Hall, the 100-room tudor mansion built by the widow of auto genius John Dodge, also serves as a cultural and conference center and as a state tourist attraction.

Students benefit greatly from MCC's location in an ideal college community. The pleasant setting, job opportunities, availability of retail stores, and access to cultural events in Rochester alone are exceptional. Yet, students can even broaden those opportunities by driving less than an hour to anywhere in the Detroit metropolitan area.

Part-time jobs help many students meet their college costs

Working part-time while attending college is becoming a more common occurrence according to an August 4 article in *USA Today*. The article quotes U.S. Department of Labor statistics, noting that half of all full-time college students from ages 16 to 24 held jobs during the past academic year.

Approximately 36% of the full-time students at MCC work part-time on campus. They hold jobs in offices, the library, maintenance, the bookstore, intramural program, the cafeteria, and various campus labs.

An additional 17% of the full-time students at MCC hold off-campus jobs, including internships built into the Bible, Legal Assistance, and Business programs. The MCC Student Services Office maintains a job bank of openings in the local area. Currently, help wanted signs are posted throughout the community.
