FIVE COLLEGE PRESIDENTS TO SPEAK

Christians of the north-central United States will have an opportunity for the most extensive and thorough study of the theme "Christian Education" during the Second Annual N.C.C.C. Lectureship to be held from Sunday, October 11 through Thursday, October 15.

A total of 12 Christian college administrators will be among the speakers, including 5 college presidents, 3 college deans and 2 presidents-emeritus.

The program, enlarged from last year to include morning sessions, is designed to be as informative as possible on a subject which has not long been familiar to the people of this area.

Following only 2 weeks after the beginning of classes at North Central, the Lectureship will be conducted on the college campus as much as present facilities will permit.

LADIES' CLASS A FEATURE

One of the most popular features of the 1958 Lectureship was the ladies' class. Myrtle Overmeyer, experienced lecturer and teacher, will direct the class this year. A graduate of Abilene Christian College, Sister Overmeyer received her M.A. degree from Geo. Peabody College in Nashville, Tenn. Her experience includes 7 years as Dean of Women at David Lipscomb College and several years as an instructor in Indiana public schools.

FORMAL OPENING OF N.C.C.C.

The people of the community have been invited to the Formal Opening of North Central Christian College on Tuesday evening at the Rochester High School. Community officials and representatives of service organizations are expected to be present.
