Alumni Constitution Ratified

"This organization shall be known as the 'Alumni Association of Michigan Christian College' and shall hereinafter be designated as 'the Association'." Thus reads Article 1 in the newly adopted Alumni Constitution.

May 1, 1964 marked the deadline for returning ballots which, along with a copy of the proposed constitution, had been mailed to ex-students of Michigan Christian College and North Central Christian College. The proposed document had been prepared by an Alumni Constitution Committee consisting of Leonard Blake (Chairman), Rodney Grantham, Doris Berry, and Larry Leslie. Following approval by the Board of Directors of Michigan Christian College, the bylaw was thus presented to the Alumni for ratification.

According to Rodney Grantham, present chairman of the Constitution Committe, and Leonard Blake, past chairman, the constitution was adopted without a single dissenting vote.

Article 2 of the Constitution states: "The purposes of the Association shall be to promote the welfare of Michigan Christian College, to perpetuate and broaden her sphere of influence, and to promote a mutually beneficial relationship between Michigan Christian College and her alumni by:

- a. Keeping an informed membership,
- b. Stimulating an active interest in the school program,:
- c. Perpetuating the contacts of alumni with each other, and
- d. Stimulating active participation in projects designed to promote the growth and welfare of Michigan Christian College and the Association.

Other articles provide definitions of membership, description of offices and election of officers, appointment of the Executive Committee, function of the Association, forming of local chapters, fiscal regulations, and other appropriate governing rules. The Constitution further provides for annual meetings of the Association during Lectureship Week and Commencement Week.

Annual Spring Rally Held Funds Raised for New Dorm

A successful climax to a financial campaign was seen on May 15 at the Masonic Temple when the sum of \$190,000.00 was pledged to Michigan Christian College to erect a new girls' dormitory. The drive was led by Otis Gatewood, MCC's first president. Several hundred people were on hand at this, the sixth annual May rally conducted by the college.

One of the first items on the program was the burning of the mortgage of the land contract. This was done by Chairman Wheeler Utley on behalf of the board of directors and administration. Following this, former President Gatewood led in the campaign to subscribe money for the Alma Gatewood Memorial Dormitory. Appeals had been made to friends of MCC throughout the United States, and primarily in the Michigan area.

This new dormitory will be distinctive in that it will be dedicated not only to the late Alma Gatewood, but to many other Christian women also. Gatewood encouraged friends of the school to select 50 Christian women and raise or give \$5000.00 in honor of each of these women. The women would be thus honored with plaques on the various rooms of the dormitory and a special memorial library in the parlor of the building.

"Alumni News" Welcomed by Exes

April 25, 1964 was significant to the Alumni of Michigan Christian College in that it brought about the first printing of the "Alumni News".

MCC, although in existence for five years, has only recently begun a well-defined organization of the Alumni Association. The "Alumni News" will, of course, be the official publication of the Association and will be a means through which all exes can stay abreast of recent developments. It will keep members of the Association informed of specific news of former classmates and at the same time let them know what is happening back "on campus".

Following the first printing of the bulletin, favorable comments came from exes in various parts of the world. Many expressed that they were happy to have such a publication and that they would be looking forward to each quarterly printing.

Foreign Students Attend Summer Classes
