today ... 7 years later

Michigan Christian College has grown each succeeding year since its beginning in 1959. The buildings shown here have served adequately during this time. But student enrollment has increased from 54 in 1959 to 260 for the Fall of 1966.

Physical re-arrangement of these buildings to take care of annual student body increase has reached the limit. Some students requiring residence facilities have been turned away. Additional facilities for next year's increase is imperative.

Michigan Christian College began in 1959 with 37 acres and added 7 acres in 1964. Through the wise and patient action of the Board of Directors and with the help of many people, a 54-acre estate adjacent to the campus was acquired in 1965 at a most reasonable financial arrangement.

This land acquisition (shown in the aerial photo, r.) is proving to be the vital margin of difference in the future expansion and development of Michigan Christian College. With 98 acres, including 2 beautiful lakes, the land requirements for the future growth of the college are assured.

Some money has already been given for this much needed building which will honor sixty-one great Christian women of this and past generations.

This residence hall, housing 120 boarding women, must be built now if additional young women seeking a Christian education at MCC are to be admitted next year.



campaign needs defined

The immediate needs which this campaign will furnish includes a women's dormitory for 120 girls and a library building to house 30,000 volumes with corresponding study area. These must be considered imperative and of urgent consideration.

These and future buildings require extensive underground piping and wiring systems as well as landscaping and other campus improvements.

The Operational Supplement is a category based on the fact that all sources of college income (from tuition and fees, auxiliary projects of the Ladies Associates and Men's Club, and Living Endowment income) do not meet the day to day cost of operating the college. This item is intended to underwrite annual operating costs. All in all, the Campaign goal is very realistic and very needful to the proper growth of Michigan Christian College.
