
#### **Our Present**




#### **Our Future**

The leaders of Michigan Christian College understand that they must continually seek new ways to achieve the college's mission in a changing society. The college must do all it can both to attract students and to make sure they receive the best possible academic education within a Christian environment. That is why the college's strategic plan calls for prudent academic program expansion, additional upgrading of campus facilities, more selective admissions policies, and continued recruitment of the best faculty available.















# **Campaign Priorities**

This campaign is an important first step toward completion of a master plan for campus facilities. It will provide facilities essential to the mission and future of Michigan Christian College. Successful completion of this \$2.9 million program over three years will accomplish a variety of objectives.

## Residence Halls

For the college to continue to grow, adequate housing must be available for students. Present residence halls are crowded. Additional housing is needed or enrollment will be restricted to present levels at a time when expanded programs are attracting more students to Michigan Christian College.

Two residence halls, one for men and one for women, each housing approximately seventy students, will relieve overcrowding and meet the critical need for additional student housing.

# **Campus Commons**

Enrollment growth creates pressures in the day-to-day social and academic life of the campus. The present student center, laundry facilities, and social space are only marginally adequate for current enrollment. With more campus population, additional facilities serving these functions must be provided. This campaign includes construction of a *Campus Commons* area that will join the new residence halls. The *Campus Commons* will provide social space, mailboxes, and a laundry facility, greatly improving the quality of life on campus.

# **Campus Entryway**

To meet city and county codes, changes in campus roads and parking areas are required. These improvements will enhance the natural beauty of the campus. A redesigned entrance to campus will provide a distinguished collegiate image.

# Base of the Campaign

All friends of Michigan Christian College will be asked to participate in the campaign. To keep the program organized, various groups are being asked to become involved at certain times. Such groups include the Board of Trustees, college personnel, alumni, parents of students, students, and friends of the college. Plans are being made to involve other sources, such as foundations and corporations.



A strength of the campaign is a three-year (thirty-six month) commitment opportunity made available to each donor. This type of giving program allows donors to make financial plans, which hopefully will result in their being able to participate in the campaign at a higher level of giving. Remember, commitments to this campaign are intended to be over and above current giving to Michigan Christian College.





# **Workers Commit First**

No one will be solicited by any campaign staff member or volunteer who has not first made a commitment to the campaign.

## **One-Time Cash Gifts**

While one-time gifts will be accepted, the college primarily is seeking longer term commitments. A gift size almost always will be larger if it can be extended over a period of several years.
