
Campus renovation plans announced by new president

"Change is the dynamic of every organization," stated Dr. Ken Johnson, new president of Michigan Christian College, as he recently opened the college's thirty-third academic year. As he shared his goals and dreams for the future, Dr. Johnson announced his plans to change the appearance of campus by making renovations a top priority.

As a first phase in campus improvements, Dr. Johnson revealed plans to renovate common space areas. He stated that improvements would begin in the lobbies of the residence halls, followed by such areas as the cafeteria and student center. By the time of that announcement, workers had already removed lobby furnishings and painted the Associates Campus Center lobby. Within two weeks, each of the lobbies had a new look with the arrival of new furnishings and partial replacement of carpeting.

At the opening session, Dr. Johnson also introduced Candace Cain as the new dean of students. He told of her background in student services, as well as her experience as an interior decorator, which will allow her to play a key role in renovation projects. In the first project, Dean Cain directed improvements in each lobby, and painted an attractive mural on a Campus Center wall.

In his opening session address, Dr. Johnson also unveiled plans for a Spring Service Encampment. During the encampment, volunteers will participate in numerous renovation projects, with a goal of refurbishing the entire campus within a two-year period.





Trustee Scholarship introduced for fall

Students interested in attending Michigan Christian College next fall may now apply for the largest scholarship ever offered by the college. A number of Trustee Scholarships will be awarded to new students in increments that will cover full, three-quarters, or half of the annual cost for tuition, room, and board.

Applicants for Trustee Scholarships must have a minimum high school grade point average of 3.00 and a minimum ACT composite score of 21. Scholarship winners will be selected upon the basis of grades, test scores, leadership abilities, and involvement in church activities. Requirements for each award increase with the size of the award. Trustee Scholarships may be renewed for subsequent years at MCC based upon continued academic achievement and positive contributions to campus life.

Students interested in applying for a Trustee Scholarship should apply for admission immediately since acceptance is required of scholarship applicants. Trustee Scholarship applications must be submitted by March 15, 1992. Scholarship winners will be announced on April 1, 1992.

In addition to the introduction of the new Trustee Scholarships, new levels in the regular Academic and ACT Scholarships will become effective next fall as well. Those scholarships are granted automatically to eligible students in amounts ranging from \$600 to \$3,000 per year.
