Additional academic options scheduled for fall semester

Plans have been finalized for Michigan Christian College to add two new majors to the academic program. While arranging details for those majors, college officials also are preparing for implementation of a four-year business degree and a host of "2+2" programs.

The college plans to begin offering two new majors in the Bachelor of Religious Education program this fall. One major in youth and family ministry and another in missions will be added to current four-year programs in Bible, Christian ministry, and counseling.

Bringing the college one step closer to approval for offering the Bachelor of Business Administration degree, Mr. Steve Williams has been added to the faculty to lead the business program. Initially, the college plans to offer B.B.A. majors in marketing, management, human resources management, and general business.

The college also has initiated the process of building several hundred "2+2" degree plans that will flow directly into specific bachelor degree programs at about thirty universities in the North Central states. These plans cover a wide variety of majors, and are designed to accommodate virtually any high school graduate, regardless of career interest.

By following the "2+2" degree plans, students will not have to sacrifice the desire for a degree from a nationally-recognized university. However, the plans will allow them to benefit from a Christian college experience during their first two years of college.

At a Glance

Traditional events highlighted the winter months, as students and off-campus guests shared the activities of Homecoming and Celebration Weekend. The theatre and music departments presented the classic musical *South Pacific* during Celebration Weekend (pictured above). An overflow crowd on Saturday afternoon required the use of video monitors in adjoining rooms for the sponsors of the youth groups that attended Celebration Saturday.

Taking second place in the Great Lakes District of the NSCAA, the men's basketball team entered the national finals in Dallas, Texas, on March 9 with a 19-7 season record. The women's team improved throughout the year, winning five of their last seven games.

In addition to the Trustee Scholarships announced last fall, two new scholarships have been established for students entering Michigan Christian College in September. Recipients of a new Gallaher Leadership Award will receive up to \$1,500 per year for leadership skills. Students with a parent who is employed full-time by a church, Christian school, children's home, or any other Christian organization will receive an ECHO Award of \$500 per year.

Campus renovation projects continued over semester break as employees and volunteers made improvements in the Muirhead Library, business laboratories, and cafeteria. The efforts marked further progress in Dr. Ken Johnson's goal to refurbish the entire campus within a two-year period.

Michigan's largest Civil War historical society, the Michigan Regimental Round Table, featured Dr. John Todd at a recent meeting. The assistant professor of political science from MCC spoke to the elite body about *The Civil War as Fought in the Supreme Court*.
